

HOME ECONOMICS CREATES BETTER HOMES

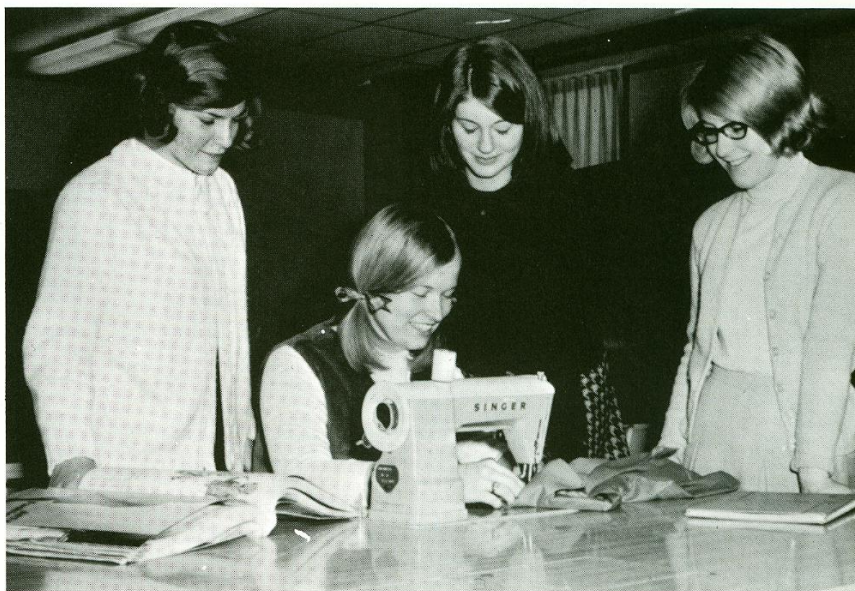
